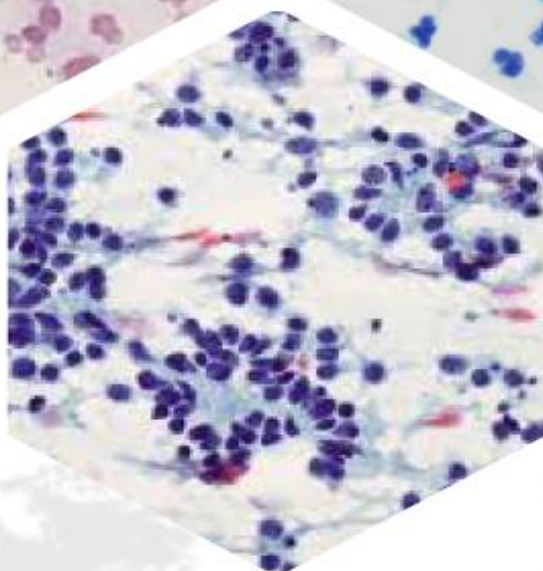
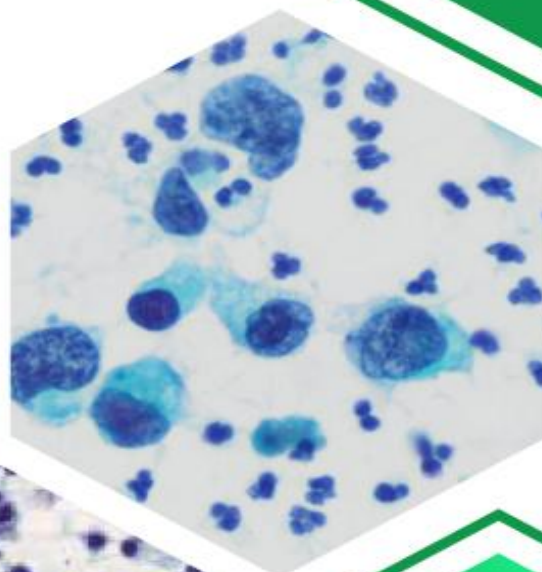
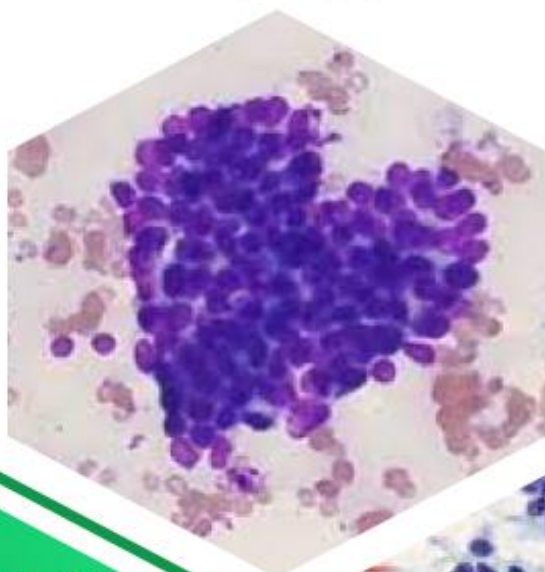




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Προσκεκλημένοι ομιλητές



Ritu Nayar is Professor of Pathology and Medical Education, Executive Vice Chair of Pathology and Director of Cytopathology at Northwestern University Feinberg School of Medicine, Chicago. She has been an active advocate, leader, and educator and speaker for organized Pathology for over 30 years, having chaired committees and endeavors for several national and international professional organizations. She served as President of the American Society of Cytopathology in 2014. Currently she is member of the College of American Pathologists (CAP) Board of Governors, a Trustee and Past President for the American Board of Pathology and Co-Chair for the American Cancer Society's National Roundtable on Cervical Cancer.

Her major areas of interest include cervical cancer prevention, and medical education. She has published widely, and as Co-Editor of the Bethesda System for Reporting Cervical Cytology, Dr Nayar has played a key role in the development of standardized reporting terminology for cytopathology. She represents pathology for the development of cervical cancer screening and clinical management guidelines in the US working closely with the American Cancer Society, ASCCP and the US National Cancer Institute. As ABPath trustee, she oversees the certification exams for cytopathology and chairs the continuing certification program for practicing pathologists in the US.

In recognition of her contributions, Dr Nayar has received the following awards: the ASC Papanicolaou Lifetime Award (2018); the International Academy of Cytology Goldblatt Award (2018); the CAP Lifetime Achievement Award (2019), the ASCCP Achievement Award (2020) and the Papanicolaou Society of Cytopathology Lifetime Achievement Award (2023).



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Dr. Zubair W. Baloch earned his medical degree from Liaquat Medical University in Pakistan and completed his PhD in 1991. He then pursued pathology residency at Hahnemann University Hospital and fellowships in surgical pathology at Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center and cytopathology at the University of Pennsylvania Medical Center. In 1997, he joined the University of Pennsylvania as an assistant professor and currently serves as a professor of pathology and laboratory medicine.

Dr. Baloch has authored over 300 peer-reviewed publications, primarily focusing on endocrine and head and neck pathology. He has written numerous book chapters, delivered lectures at national and international conferences, and co-authored three books. He served as co-editor for the "Milan System for Reporting Salivary Gland Cytopathology" and contributed to the development of the "Bethesda Thyroid FNA Classification Scheme" as part of the NCI-sponsored 2007 thyroid initiative. Additionally, he was involved in renaming the encapsulated follicular variant of papillary thyroid carcinoma to non-invasive follicular tumor with papillary-like nuclear features (NIFTP).

As an editor, Dr. Baloch is the chief editor of Diagnostic Cytopathology and serves on the editorial boards of several other leading journals, including Cancer Cytopathology and Cytojournal. He chaired the ASCP scientific program committee from 2014 to 2018 and has served on numerous other committees, including those for the American Thyroid Association and American Association of Endocrinologists.

Dr. Baloch was inducted into the University of Pennsylvania Academy of Master Clinicians and has received numerous honors, including the Bripps award for best graduate teaching, Peter Nowell Award and the Kevin Salhany Award from UPenn, the ASCP President's Award, and the ASC President's Service Award.
